Old Québec

Parc de la Chute-Montmorency

Île d'Orléans

An island in the middle of the St. Lawrence River and within view of Québec City, Île d'Orléans is a historic district unlike anywhere else. Island of Orleans was one of the first parts of Québec to be colonized by the French and is a microcosm of traditional Québec. Guests are able to tour the six townships on the island, sample farm-fresh products, admire the beautiful scenery, and explore the historical and cultural heritage. Musée national des beaux-arts du Québec

Aquarium du Québec



Canyon Sainte-Anne

Hike along the banks of the Sainte-Anne-du-Nord that bring you to the magnificent 74-meter-high waterfalls of canyon Sainte-Anne. You are able to walk across three suspension bridges that are 60 m high above the abyss and explore the canyon from observation points along the entire trail. Battlefields Park

Place Royale and Petit Champlain

Home to the oldest stone church, Notre-Dame-des-Victoires, oldest commercial streets, and the first permanent French settlement in North America, Place Royale is filled with history. Guests are invited to wander the pedestrian streets that were voted Canada's most beautiful street and step back in time to the earliest days of Québec City. Citadelle of Québec

Visit the largest British fortress in North America, the Citadelle, located on Québec City's highest point, Cape Diamond. Old Por







Tuesday, March 26, 2019

√Tour — Visit Montmorency Falls and the Basilica of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré 8:00 am – 12:00 pm (depart Hilton lobby) \$40 USD per person

Organized by the Québec & Eastern Ontario Chapter – ACI

A regional excursion under the theme of relaxation: cross 40 km of road on the Chemin du Roy, the oldest roadway in New France, through the pretty villages of pure French tradition that lead to Saint-Anne-de-Beaupré. This circuit provides a stop at Montmorency Falls, a 83-meter-high waterfall on the Montmorency River (30 m higher than Niagara Falls). You'll also stop at the famous Sainte-Anne sanctuary and visit the legendary Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré Basilica, where many miracles occurred. This half-day excursion includes two stops of 35 to 45 minutes at each location.

√Tour — Visit the Observatoire de la Capitale and the Citadelle of Québec 12:45 pm – 4:30 pm (depart Hilton lobby)

\$25 USD per person

The Observatoire de la Capitale is located in the Marie-Guyart building, which is the tallest building in Québec City. At the top, you can have a 360-degree view of the city. This part lasts about 1 hour, and the building is located just in front of the Convention Center. Afterwards, there will be a visit to the Citadelle of Québec and the Royal 22e Régiment Museum. This will allow you to visit a National Historic Site with impressive architecture and spectacular views of the city and St. Lawrence River. The tour will take about 4 hours to complete. Please note this will be a walking tour. No transportation will be provided.
