#### **ELIGIBILITY**

All architects, engineers, contractors, developers and industry-related professionals are eligible to enter this competition. Projects to be nominated must have been completed between November 1, 2008 and October 31, 2009 and be located in the state of Projects engineered, design or constructed by firms, but located outside of , are eligible for awards of Merit and Excellence but not the Best Concrete Project Award.

#### **AWARDS**

The Awards Program is intended to recognize owners, architects, engineers and contractors who specify, design, and construct projects which use concrete materials. In each category, suitable plaques will be given for Award of Excellence and Awards of Merit, as selected by the Jury. The Award Jury will also select one of the projects to receive overall Best Concrete Project for the year. Awards for Technical Excellence may be given, at the discretion of the jury and Awards Committee, to any project, which has used any new and/or unique concrete process or products. The Award plaque will be given to the firm submitting a completed entry of the winning project. Additional plaques, requested for other participants for a winning project may be purchased. Recognition on the plaque shall be given only to the Owner, Architect, Structural Engineer, General Contractor, or Concrete Product Subcontractor, as applicable and determined by the Awards Committee or Awards Jury. In the case of multiple entries, the Awards Committee will determine which entry is presented to the jury and whether the submitter of the entry not judged will receive a plaque. Please fill out the Entry Form completely and carefully. The Awards Committee will not verify the information on the Entry Forms. All decisions of the jury and the Awards Committee are final.

#### **AWARDS CATEGORIES**

Projects must be of predominately concrete construction, which may be cast-in-place, precast, prestressed or post tensioned concrete or concrete masonry. More than one award of excellence or merit may be given for greatly different types of structures. The Award Categories are as follows:

High Rise, Low and Mid-Rise Buildings, - Includes office buildings, public buildings, apartments, hotels, parking garages, etc. Highways and Bridges - Includes all kinds of highway structures, bridges, and other highway concrete usage.

Industrial - Includes warehouses, & industrial buildings, etc.

Public Works - Includes stadiums, environmental structures, anything other than buildings and highway structures etc.

Paving - Includes unique paving projects, and architectural and concrete masonry pavements.

Special - Includes small residential, restoration and other concrete projects not fitting in any of the above categories.

#### PROJECTS ELIGIBLE FOR AWARDS

- The major portion of the project, including the structural system. and major portion of the exterior finish, must be constructed of concrete or concrete products.
- Awards may be given for creative, innovated, aesthetic, or imaginative uses of concrete.
- Projects may be buildings, bridges, water resources applications, or other projects essentially completed during the year of the award or the previous year and if not previously submitted. Projects may be considered in broader categories i.e. Buildings, Public Works, Transportation, etc. as the Awards Committee sees fit.
- The projects must be located within the state of Louisiana.
- Under the direction of the Awards Committee Chairman, the Committee will review all the entries as to the suitability of presentation to the Jury for award consideration and define for the Jury the categories into which the entry falls. The Committee has no obligation to submit an entry to the Jury in a category for which it believes there is no suitable entry.

#### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

All entries must contain an entry form, photographs (prints and electronic format) and a written description of the project.

Entry form: All information requested on the entry form must be completed.

Two or more professional quality 8"x 10" color prints of various views showing the project. All photographs must Photographs:

be cleared for use by the aci Louisiana Chapter. Photos selected for publication become the property of aci La. Chapter. Pictures not used will be returned on request. Ninety days from the awards banquet, all entries will be discarded.

Pictures (jpegs): All photos submitted must also be accompanied by a disc with the same photographs in an electronic format

(preferably jpeg). Pictures of winning entries will be used in a power point presentation at the aci Louisiana Chapter Annual Banquet.

Explanation of design concept, problems and solutions, aesthetic studies, project economics and any unique or Description:

innovative aspects of the project. Include 11"x 17" drawings showing elevation and typical details if available.

Entry Fee: There will be no entry fee for submittals.

#### METHOD OF PRESENTATION

Each entry should be submitted in an 8-1/2" x 11" binder, containing transparent window sleeves for displaying inserts back to back. All information requested on the entry forms should be included. Incomplete entries may not be accepted.

#### FOR A SUCCESSFUL PRESENTATION

Your entry will be submitted to a Jury whose only opportunity to evaluate the structure is through the best photographs and description you submit. For the structure to make a good impression it is imperative that full consideration be given to lighting and composition. To insure complete coverage, provide photographs in an electronic format for use during the Awards Presentation. We suggest you submit ten photos broken down in the following manner:

- 4 photos Exterior showing each face of the structure as an overview.
- 2 photos Exterior showing close-ups of outstanding features.
- 2 photos Interior showing concrete is being used on the interior and/or interior motif.
- 2 photos which may be descriptive of the architectural and/or structural accomplishment during construction or after completion. The number of photos above is more than required on the entry form for better understanding of the project features. Besides these, 1 project exterior and best 2 dominating features shall be submitted in 8"x10" photographs. A few 11"x17" reproductions (maximum of 5) of engineering drawings can be utilized to point out the best design features of the project. The lighting and subsequent mood of the structure will change from morning to night. Select the correct time of day to produce the best lighting; morning, midday, late afternoon or evening.

#### **JUDGING**

A Jury composed of professionals in design, architecture, construction and restoration of concrete projects will judge entries. The Jury will review all entries and decisions will be based only on the entry data information and materials submitted by each entrant. No on-site judging will take place.

#### **AWARDS PRESENTATION**

The winners will be notified by the end of November, 2009. Award presentation will be made to the winners at the Chapter's Annual Banquet on January 22, 2010 in New Orleans. Entries will be displayed at the Award Banquet of the aci Chapter. Banquet notices will be sent to entry submitters and project participants.

### **BEST CONCRETE PROJECT AWARD**

The Awards Committee for the Chapter of ACI is eagerly seeking construction project entries for the 14th Annual Awards Competition. projects completed between November 1, 2010 and October 31, 2011 are eligible.

Projects do not have to be "monumental." Projects which used concrete rather than other materials, have innovative design features, used creative solutions to site problems, and have pleasing aesthetics are good candidates.

Project size is <u>not</u> a criterion!

Concrete masonry projects are also eligible.

This year's entry form has an outline for the descriptive text to be submitted. Photographs of the finished projects are the most difficult item in the submittal. A sample of a completed submittal can be found on the ACI website.
