Since its creation, the Concrete Research Council has provided hundreds of thousands of dollars in funding to worthy research projects designed to advance the technologies and practices within the concrete industry. Recent CRC-endorsed or sponsored projects include:*

- Deformed Steel Fibers as Minimum Shear Reinforcement in Deep, Prestressed Concrete Hollow-core Slabs;
- Establishing Unified Durability Guidance on Chloride Ions Limits, Freeze-Thaw Performance; and External Sulfate Attack for ACI Documents;
- Update to Performance-Based Seismic Design Guidelines for Tall Buildings; and
- Towards Mechanistic Pavement Design of Pervious Concrete Pavements.

## Scholarship Council

*The ACI Foundation's Scholarship Council administers Fellowships and Scholarships to qualified graduate and undergraduate students. ACI Foundation Fellowships are offered for both undergraduate and graduate students studying at accredited American and Canadian universities and must be nominated by an ACI member faculty. Fellowships provide the following benefits:*

- An educational stipend between \$7,000 and \$15,000;
- Airfare, hotel, travel stipend, and registration for three ACI conventions;
- An industry mentor;
- An internship, if required or desired; and
- Recognition at ACI's Convention, in *Concrete International*, and on the ACI Foundation's website.

ACI Foundation Scholarships are offered to undergraduate and graduate students and are open to students worldwide. Scholarship recipients receive:

- A \$3,000 educational stipend; and
