## 6.0 Repair/Protection Council (Page)

Seven of nine endorsing organizations of Vision 2020 met at the ACI Strategic Development Council (SDC) meeting on May 3, 2006 to implement the first task of the initial 13 Vision 2020 goals; establish a Repair/Protection Council to guide and monitor concrete repair industry activities related to Vision 2020. Kelly Page was selected as Council Chair and is asked to describe Council functions and outline future plans.

## 7.0 SDC Meetings (Emmons)

In addition to the May meeting, SDC met in St. Louis on Sep 11-12, 2006. Peter Emmons is asked to report on the SDC meetings with emphasis on immediate and long-range plans to make Vision 2020 a reality.
