

Building the Future:



On Behalf of the ACI Foundation, Happy New Year!

The ACI Foundation experienced extraordinary change in 2025. The team has been committed to achieving its Strategic Plan goals. Below is a summary of how the ACI Foundation has funded students, research, and innovation for over three decades, thanks to donations and support from the ACI donor community. Within the last decade, donors have expanded their support, and ACI has committed to a generous donation package, which includes full operational support and a substantial increase in mission donations. The ACI Foundation has been able to award significantly more research grants, assist in implementing more innovations, and provide more support for students due to this revised structure and the launching of formal fundraising activities.

The ACI Foundation's primary donor, ACI, now provides about 60% of the funding for the Foundation's programs. This generous financial assistance and encouragement to grow have made it possible to enrich and enhance ACI and the concrete construction community. The ACI community—ACI individual members, corporations, ACI Chapters, and other like-minded individuals—has gifted the other 40% of mission funding. The ACI Foundation, its programs, and its impact have grown through contributions from generous donors, both large and small. Areas of growth include:

- The number of student awards for the Fellowship and Scholarship program grew from 20 to 48;
- Research support has increased from less than 100,000 to 500,000 USD annually;
- Attendance at the annual Concrete Innovation Forum has doubled; and
- The number of community donors has tripled, averaging 500,000 USD raised annually.

A cornerstone of the ACI Foundation is the Fellowship and Scholarship program, which supports the next generation of leaders. Past student awardees include Ken Hover, ACI Honorary Member and Past President; Michael Tholen, ACI Senior Managing Director of Technical Operations; Anthony DeCarlo Jr., FACI, and past member of the ACI Board of Direction; Tyler Ley, FACI; Lisa Feldman, FACI; and Christopher Motter—all top researchers in the concrete field. Nearly 70% of Fellowship recipients continue to become active ACI members, and over 90% of awardees have remained in the concrete industry.

The ACI Foundation recently transformed its approach to funding and supporting research and innovation within the concrete industry. This new format aims to:

- Be more proactive and strategic in identifying, prioritizing,

and funding critical research and innovation initiatives that help solve industry challenges;

- Increase the potential for collaboration and partnership with ACI committees and industry stakeholders;
- Provide balanced support for both defined and undefined research; and
- Ensure broader industry engagement to identify critical industry needs.

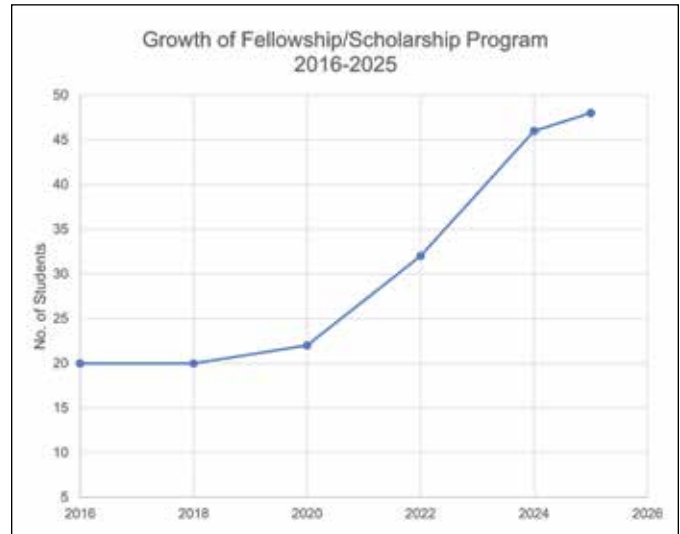
